12 THROUGH 19, RESPECTIVELY, AND REQUESTING)
13 THE STATE HISTORICAL RESOURCES COMMISSION)
14 TO REGISTER SAID TRAILS.)

11 WHEREAS, on September 8, 1977, the Santa Barbara County
12 Historical Landmark Advisory Committee declared the Arroyo Burro
13 Trail, the Rattlesnake Trail, the Hot Spring Trail, the Romero
14 Canyon Trail, the Rincon Trail, and the Fremont Trail to be
15 historical landmarks pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 18A of
16 the Santa Barbara County Code; and,

17 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa
18 Barbara, after a duly advertised public hearing, has found the
19 Arroyo Burro Trail, the Rattlesnake Trail, the Hot Spring Trail,
20 the Romero Canyon Trail, the Rincon Trail, and the Fremont Trail
21 to have historical interest to the general public as landmarks in
22 Santa Barbara County; and,

23 WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors deems the said historic
24 trails to be worthy of protection and preservation as landmarks
25 of the California historic aboriginal and hispanic periods;

26 NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

27 1. The Board of Supervisors, having duly set a public
28 hearing for November 7, 1977, has duly conducted said hearing,
29 heard all interested parties, and has concluded said public
30 hearing.

31 2. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares the Arroyo
32 Burro Trail, the Rattlesnake Trail, the Hot Spring Trail, the

1 Romero Canyon Trail, the Rincon Trail, and the Fremont Trail to
2 be respectively Historical Landmarks Nos. 14 through 19, inclusive,
3 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 18A of the Santa Barbara
4 County Code.

5 3. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby
6 directed to request the State Historical Resources Commission to
7 register the said historic trails by number and description
8 either as "historical landmarks" or as "points of historic
9 interest," and to provide or cause to be provided appropriate
10 plaques, markers and directional signs therefor, as provided in
11 Public Resources Code Sections 5021 to 5022.6, inclusive.
